Since he was a child, Forrest has always had an adventurous spirit. It kept his mind active and young, but his body just couldn't keep up. He was diagnosed with kidney cancer. The doctors told him that his chances of survival were low, so he started thinking of what he should do with his wealth. Just giving it away wouldn't be very satisfying for his adventurous spirit. He wanted a original way to share his riches. That's when he thought of a treasure hunt.

Forrest used an antique bronze chest and filled it with 256 gold coins, "hundreds of gold nuggets - some as large as chicken eggs, ancient Chinese carved jade figures, Pre-Columbian gold animal artifacts, lots of rubies, emeralds, sapphires, diamonds and other valuable things." Its estimated value is at least \$2 million.
